
School Meals

Recycle to Read Batteries Collection



How can you help?

Hunt out used batteries at home. We are collecting AA, AAA, C, D, 9V and button batteries. Tape over the contacts of lithium (Li) and button batteries (see below). Put them in a tied plastic bag (preferably reused) Take them to the school's collection point in the office or hand them to your class teacher. Enter the prize draw at jointhepod.org/win

Safety first:

- Not only is storing and recycling batteries safely great for the environment, it can also help reduce risks associated with batteries:
- Batteries can cause serious injury or death if swallowed, please keep batteries out of reach of small children and pets.
- Lithium and button batteries need to be taped so their contacts don't touch, as they could short circuit if they do. Use sticky tape over the contacts (top and bottom of batteries). Button batteries can be placed in a line between two sections of sticky tape. Lithium batteries can look like any battery, but they will have lithium (Li) written on them.
