Reading and Phonics

Unfortunately, there has been an increase in the number of children not returning their reading book. If you have incurred a fine and then return the book, your fine will be reimbursed.

The Phonics Reading Check for Y1 children and some Y2 children will take place during the first week back after half term. It is, therefore, more important than ever that all children read at home and practise any phonic homework sent. Our monthly meeting with our Reading Link from 'Read Write Inc' also took place this week and she was delighted with the progress the children are making, but stressed the importance again of home reading taking place. Please read at home with your child every day.
